COVID-19 Summary

“The light at the end of the tunnel.....”

“.....is a train coming the other way” – in the near future. The Regional Stay-at-Home Order remains in effect until at least January 1st. Projections show that it is virtually impossible to expect that we will be released from that order anytime soon, let alone January 1st. That means all types of lodging must stay closed indefinitely, and restaurants can only be open for take out or delivery. Ski areas may operate with significant modifications. Vaccine: This week, Alpine County Health Department received its first shipment of the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine, and the Washoe Tribal Health Center in Dresslerville received their first shipments of the Pfizer vaccine. They are equivalent in terms of safety and effectiveness. While this gets us started in protecting our frontline health care workers, including those first responders who answer 911 calls, it will be a while before we can vaccinate everyone who wants it. We will follow federal and state guidelines in prioritizing vaccination for those who work in essential sectors such as emergency services and education, and those in our community who are at higher risk and vulnerable to severe outcomes if they become infected. These Public Health Briefs will be the route of notification to you as to when you will become eligible to get vaccinated. Stay tuned!

We have a difficult few months ahead of us, where vaccine will not make a dent in cases, hospitalizations, or deaths.
