Application of Interest for State and Private Forestry Restoration Assistance

This application is for Alpine County landowners to indicate their interest in seeking assistance for restoration of their lands impacted by the Tamarack Fire. Completion and return of this form indicate your interest only, it is not a commitment to participate in the program. The Alpine County Tamarack Fire Restoration Team will then contact you to discuss the specific restoration needs on your property.

Alpine County has received funds to assist private landowners with fire related restoration. Information obtained from this form will the County identify restoration funding opportunities on private lands. Alpine County will review these applications and respond back to the landowner with next steps including on-site assessments for further project development.

Alpine County State and Private Forestry Grant – Tamarack Fire Emergency Forest Restoration

The federal government, acting through the US Forest Service, awarded a restoration grant to Alpine County. This grant provides for the identification, assessment, design, implementation, and monitoring of wildfire restoration activities on State, County, and Private lands impacted by the Tamarack Fire.

The Tamarack fire impacted approximately 8,000 acres of private lands in Alpine County, some of which have already begun restoration activities. It is possible that restoration support can be provided to land already under restoration, however the first effort of Alpine County is to identify those landowners that are not otherwise enrolled in a state or federal program. Over the next several months the Tamarack Emergency Forest Restoration Team (Tamarack EFRT) will identify interested landowners and discuss appropriate restoration support for those properties, in the context of the landowners objectives and the overall landscape restoration process on surrounding public and private lands.

The Alpine County Board of Supervisors has selected a team of consultants to assist with the implementation of the program and has allocated funding to conduct program work through June 2025. It is the intent of Alpine County to sponsor the identification, design, regulatory permitting, and implementation of restoration activities on private lands impacted by the 2021 Tamarack Fire.
